





What you can do to attract new contributors



#1 - Customize the Community Page

- Set the hero image
- Link to your community's policies
- Update the to-do list (see next slide for more!)

See <u>Help:Community_Page</u> for more information.



#2 - Suggest easy to perform first tasks

- Suggest pages to edit on the Community Page, Main Page, or in messages to new users.
- Most edits by new people are minor text edits.
- Some suggested tasks for new contributors:
 - Update pages about a recent or upcoming event
 - Review pages for grammar
 - Participate in an "Improvement Drive" style initiative
 - Join a task force
 - Adopt a page to monitor and edit



#3 - Keep the site welcoming

- If you customize your site with CSS or JS, please try to keep the edit buttons visible and readable.
- Keep your main pages welcoming and supportive for good contributors.





What you can do to retain new contributors



#1 - Assume good faith

- Block obvious vandals and spammers but attempt to educate new users first.
- Remember that most people have never edited a wiki before.
- A person can learn tools and learn guidelines, but the courage and willingness cannot be taught.

#2 - Be constructive

- Don't assume a new contributor has read every policy. Send them a link when you greet them!
- If they made a mistake, provide an example of the correct way to do something.
- If the user needs to learn how wikitext or the VisualEditor work, point users to experiment with their editing tools on a sandbox page or their user page.



#3 - Celebrate good work

- When somebody does something great, make sure you let them know!
- If you have many users, consider giving out recurring awards.
- If a user is remarkable, consider giving them guidance on how to become a Moderator or Administrator.
